Safety is the 'trick' for 'treats'

CAMP FOSTER (Oct 31, 2003) --

Halloween is a celebration dating back to the ancient Celtic festival of Samhain more than 2,000 years ago. As the years have gone by, Halloween traditions and celebrations have evolved.

According to the History Channel Web site, Americans began to dress up in costumes and go house-to-house asking for food or money in the 1800's. The population of Irish people who immigrated to America is noted for starting the modern-day form of celebration, which eventually evolved into what is now called "trick-or-treating."

According to Capt. Vincent Bosquez, officer in charge, Camp Services, Headquarters & Service Battalion, Marine Corps Base, a large number of

Department of Defense members intend on enjoying the holiday "trick-or-treating", however it is important to remember about safety and responsibility while doing so.

"Halloween is a fun time for children, but they can sometimes forget about safety," Bosquez said. "It is vital to ensure someone responsible is supervising children while they are 'trick-or-treating.'"

Halloween safety begins with costume preparation and ensuring children have the proper safety devices.

According to the SafeChild Web site, children should avoid the use of non-toxic face paints, as well as masks, scarves and hats that can restrict vision or breathing. The Web site also said it is highly recommended to carry a flashlight and put reflective tape on costumes to increase visibility to motorists.

Bosquez added that motorists also have a role in Halloween safety. He said that even though "trick-or-treaters" should only use sidewalks, drivers should still be cautious.

"Be extra careful when entering or exiting driveways to make sure there are no children walking across," he said.

Another issue Bosquez addressed was the inspection of the treats children receive. He said that children should not eat any of their treats until they return home and have their parents inspect it to ensure it is safe for consumption. Anything damaged or not in its original wrapper, should be discarded.

In addition to ensuring proper safety measures are taken during the holiday, each camp will set a certain time that children can go "trick-or-treating". Bosquez said each camp commander's office will release a newsletter stating these times as well as additional safety tips.

He added that by following the safety guidelines, everyone could have a safe and happy Halloween.
